Electrification



Problem:

70-90% of Africa's energy comes from burning biofuels (wood, crop waste) which is inefficient and harmful to people and the environment.

Analysis:

Energy shortage due to hundreds of years of exploitation by Europe, the US and other imperialist nations.

Africa has enough energy to meet its own needs.

- Hydro-power in Congo
- Oil & gas in the north, west
- Coal in the south
- Geothermal: Red Sea, Rift Valleys
- Wind and sunlight abundant throughout

Plan: solar / micro-hydro / wind power

Community involvement in:

- Site evaluations
- System designs
- Implementation

Access to clean water



Problem:

Over half of the people in Africa lack access to safe drinking water.

Analysis:

Underlying cause for water crisis is exploitation and purposeful underdevelopment by the US and Europe who effectively control the post-colonial states of Africa.

Plan: rainwater collection / purification

Community involvement in:

- Site evaluations to assess water quantity, quality, hygiene and sanitation - starting Nov. 2006
- System design development and implementation of collection, storage and filtration / purification

Future Project:

Community Healthworkers Program

Will train local community members to perform preventative medical services, act as liaisons between the community and existing health system, and provide basic primary health services.
